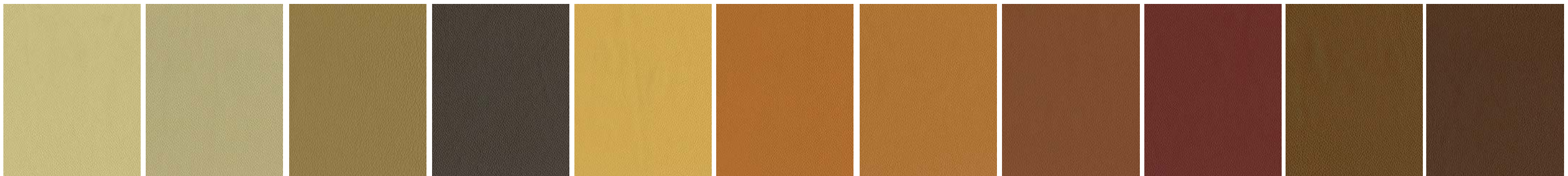

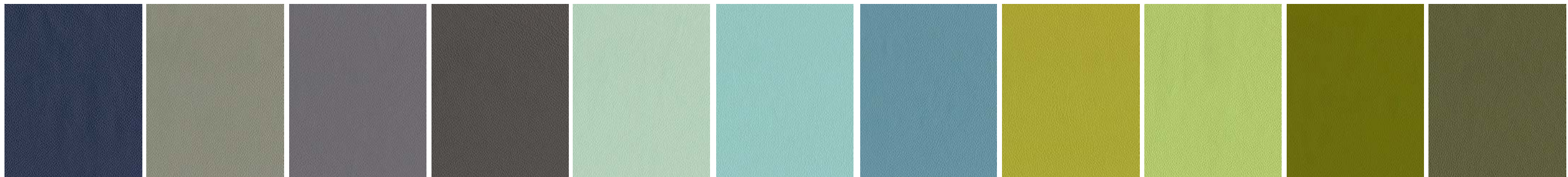

Note: 17 square feet of leather is required for a yard of upholstery fabric, Average hide measurement is approximately 55 to 60 square feet.

Care & Maintenance Dust regularly with a clean, soft cloth. Regular cleaning with a soft, damp cloth is all that is needed to keep your leather beautiful. Should you need a more vigorous cleaning, use only a solution of mild soap and water. Blot gently; never rub aggressively. Never use a cleaner with solvents, alcohol, or wax. Should you use a leather cleaner, always test in a hidden area first.

Natural Characteristics Healed scars, scratches, cuts and stretch marks are all natural markings and are characteristic of leather.
